These sacramental graces heal us, transform us, and conform us to Christ. They unite us, in a living way, with Jesus, our Savior.</p>

		<p>We also receive an outpouring of the gifts of the Holy Spirit and the grace to be soldiers of Christ.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Eucharist: We receive the Body and Blood of our Lord and the grace to love Jesus with all our hearts and our neighbors as ourselves. We are united in the Mystical Body of Christ and are strengthened and nourished by the Eucharist. • Penance: We are restored in sanctifying grace and given the grace to overcome our sins. For example, if we confess to lying, God will help us to overcome the sin of lying. • Anointing of the Sick: We are given the grace to suffer well and die faithfully. We are united to Christ in his Passion so we can be united with Christ in his Resurrection. • Holy Orders: Priests are given the grace to live holy lives and administer the Sacraments. They are also given the grace to live their promises of celibacy and obedience. • Matrimony: Spouses are given grace to love each other and raise children in the Faith by their teaching and example.
